Repetition of rhymes and stories is good for the brain, teaching how language works and building memory capabilities. Nursery rhymes help develop inferencing skills, both with encountering new words and in reading comprehension. Because these verses are made up of patterns, they are easy first memorization pieces. Nursery rhymes are important for language acquisition and help with speech development. They help children develop auditory skills such as discriminating between sounds and developing the ear for the music of words. The mouth and tongue muscles are developed as children say these rhymes. Nursery rhymes increase vocabulary. Nursery rhymes expand children's imagination. Nursery rhymes are full of patterns, sequencing, numbers, and counting.
